

Rules for Travelling with Children (from 1 June 2015)

- all adults travelling with children will need to produce a copy of an unabridged birth certificate for each child they are travelling with

- **One parent travelling with a child** - In instances where one parent is travelling with a child the following documents must be produced for immigration officials:
 - A copy of an unabridged birth certificate reflecting the particulars of the parents of the child
 - An affidavit from the other parent or legal guardian of the child, confirming their consent for the accompanying adult to travel with the child
 - Single parents are required to produce a court order (and not just an affidavit) granting full parental responsibilities and rights or legal guardianship in respect of the child, if he or she is the parent or legal guardian of the child, and
 - If applicable, a death certificate of a deceased parent must be produced

- **Adult travelling with a child who is not his or her biological child**
 - A copy of an unabridged birth certificate
 - An affidavit from the parents or legal guardian of the child, confirming their consent for the accompanying adult to travel with the child
 - Copies of the identity documents or passports of the parents or legal guardians of the child
 - Contact details of the parents or legal guardians of the child.
